The B.S. in Accounting qualifies students to take the CPA exam in the state of NJ. However, to qualify for a CPA license, students need to take an additional five course units (20 credits) to satisfy the state-mandated 150-hour requirement. Accounting majors may complete one internship as an elective course for credit towards graduation. Additional internships (one additional during semesters or summers) can be taken towards the 150 credit CPA requirement.
