

DANIEL R. HALL SOCIAL JUSTICE SCHOLARSHIP

DIRECTIONS FOR APPLICATION

The Award: The purpose of this scholarship is to continue Daniel Hall's advocacy of increasing social justice or social welfare concerns among students.

Criteria:

The recipient must:

- be a rising senior
- be an Economics major (B.S. or B.A.)
- demonstrate and document involvement in a past or ongoing campus or community-based activity which fosters social justice/welfare in addition to any required involvements such as the Community Engage Learning (CEL) experience or Bonnor program.
- write a research paper concerning a social justice/welfare topic.

Suggested, but not required, topics include:

1. income inequality.
2. sustainable resource use.
3. differential access to employment, health, education, opportunities by minorities or segments of society based on race, gender, immigration status, and level of economic development.
4. policy consequences for various segments of society of the above or similar topics.

The paper should include:

- examination of a hypothesis including where relevant, appropriate empirical data and econometrics.
- the significance of the topic examined.
- the clarity of its presentation.
- relevance of the conclusions/policy recommendations to the material presented.
- write a statement documenting community involvement and also provide documentation from supervisors or managers from relevant organizations who can attest to the duration, role and beneficial impacts for either or both the community and the student. Involvement of such programs as the Bonner Center or Community Engaged Learning (CEL) activities do not qualify.
